Entrepreneurs looking to establish a food processing business in Mizoram must register their industry under relevant state and national authorities. Below is a step-by-step guide on the **industry registration process** and **required documents** for setting up a food manufacturing business in Mizoram for ODOP

Step-by-Step Industry Registration Procedure

Step 1: Business Entity Registration

- Choose a business structure:
 - o **Sole Proprietorship** Ideal for small businesses
 - o **Partnership Firm** Requires a partnership deed
- Registration Authority:
 - Registrar of Companies (ROC), Ministry of Corporate Affairs for LLPs and Pvt. Ltd. Companies
 - Registrar of Firms (State Government) for sole proprietorships and partnerships

Step 2: Industry Registration under MSME (Udyam Registration)

- Mandatory for: Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs)
- Where to Apply: <u>Udyam Registration Portal</u>
- Documents Required:

Step 3: FSSAI Food Business License

Entrepreneurs can use Common Facility Centers (CFCs) for manufacturing, processing, packaging, and quality testing.

Example CFCs in Mizoram:

1. Zoram Mega Food Park (Khamrang, Kolasib District)

o Facilities: Cold storage, drying units, packaging

Usage Fees: Based on processing capacity

2. Mission Organic Mizoram (MOM) Processing Units

o Facilities: Organic processing for turmeric, ginger, and passion fruit

V. Applicable schemes for branding, packaging and export promotion

The PMFME Scheme, under Aatmanirbhar Bharat Abhiyan and MoFPI, supports individual and group food processing enterprises. It includes assistance for marketing and branding—covering common branding, packaging, and product standardization—determined by the SNA. Proposals must be prepared by the SNA, with support capped at 50% of total expenditure and subject to a prescribed maximum grant.

The State Nodal Agency (Directorate of Commerce & Industries) has facilitated beneficiary participation in key food processing events like World Food India 2024, North East Food Fest, and others. Though few beneficiaries attend, these events help promote local products, boost exports, strengthen the state's economy, and inspire youth to join food processing.
